

Syllable Segmenting

Objective

Students will use counters or chips to segment words into syllables.

Materials

- Counters (four per student)
- Syllable Segmenting handout
- Optional video for teacher:
Multisyllabic Words (<http://texasgateway.org/resource/multisyllabic-words>)

Overview

Explicitly model this auditory activity and provide students with multiple opportunities for practice with corrective feedback.

Activity

1. Provide each student with a Syllable Segmenting handout and four counters.
2. Say the name of a student and model clapping out the syllables.
3. Have students repeat the name and clap the syllables.
4. Have students segment the name into syllables, placing a counter into a box on the handout as they say each syllable.
5. Say a two-, three-, or four-syllable word (see examples below).
 - Two-syllable examples: *hammer, yellow, apple, farmer*
 - Three-syllable examples: *family, happiness, forgetful, medicine*
 - Four-syllable examples: *operation, kindergarten, emergency, understanding*
6. Have students repeat the word and clap the syllables.
7. Have students segment the word into syllables, placing a counter into a box as they say each syllable. Monitor the activity.
